POSTERS

The tradition of the "posters session" is now well established at IMSSS symposia. Anyone wishing to present their current research on preaching or sermon studies is strongly encouraged to prepare a poster. During the Symposium, the posters will be presented and discussed with all participants.

Presenters should send a written proposal to the organizers of the Symposium, included as part of the registration form. Please include a title and summary proposal of no more than 50 words.

Some tips for poster presenters:

- *Size of the poster*: rectangle whose surface is at least equivalent to that of 8 pieces of A4 (letter paper format) or 4 A3 sheets, juxtaposed.
- Design: font size, colours, texts and images may vary. Please make sure that the poster is easily readable and well organized. Priority should be given to a specific idea(s), or an issue or question your research has raised. Where possible, it should also include an outline of the approach or method used. And ideally it should be designed to spark dialogue and discussion with and among conference participants.
- The poster should include the name of the researcher along with his or her contact information.


Once you are in Madrid, you can reach Salamanca using several means of transport:

• Madrid-Salamanca coach (the more recommended means of transport), with the company *Avanzabus*: www.avanzabus.com (choose the EXPRESS service)

The Madrid-Salamanca, Salamanca-Madrid EXPRESS service departs every hour, between 7 a.m. and 22 p.m. (for weekend schedules, please consult their timetable). We recommend the direct service, fast and comfortable (it takes 2h. 15 minutes, approximately, between Madrid and Salamanca).

Salamanca's coach station is close to the Colegio Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. It may be advisable to get a taxi at the station, although you can arrive there on foot (in around 10 minutes).





• Madrid-Salamanca Train

Trains from Madrid arrive only three times a day at Salamanca's train station, which is located a considerable distance from the *Colegio de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe*: making it necessary to get a taxi to reach the *Colegio*.

ACCOMODATION

OPTION A

The Colegio Mayor Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe is a college belonging to the Universidad Pontificia of Salamanca whose tradition in university education dates back to 1951.

It is strongly advised to choose this option of accommodation, which is, by far, the most economical.

Unfortunately, there are few double rooms available.

Location

The *Colegio Mayor* is a modern building, opened in 2003. It is located on 28-62 José de Lamano Beneite Street, next to the UPSA campus (Communication Faculty and Education School) and opposite *Huerta Otea* park. You can reach the city centre on foot in 20-25 minutes. A bus stop of the line that connects the campus with the city centre can be found close to the *Colegio*.

Facilities

The *Colegio* has 150 single ensuite rooms, completely furnished, with telephone and Internet connection.

The college has several television rooms, leisure rooms, classrooms, laundry, assembly hall, library, chapel, oratory, canteen, tennis and paddle courts, sports area, a small gym, outdoors parking area and big green spaces. Just opposite the college there is a big public park situated on the bank of the river *Tormes*.

Five different newspapers are available every day.


OPTION B
